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
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

Services: Treatment Courts are a unique partnership where the Court, prosecutors, defense attorneys and drug/alcohol treatment providers, work collaboratively toward a goal of assisting a criminal offender with the tools and support to enjoy an addiction free life. Participants are required to sign a contract and treatment is mandatory. Testing for compliance takes place in and out of court. Participants are supervised by the Court on a weekly basis and can expect to attend for at least a year. By graduation, participants are required to have gainful employment and/or be enrolled in an educational program. Auburn Drug and Treatment Court is also a hub court. This allows eligible cases pending in Cayuga County to participate in Auburn Treatment Court. Treatment Courts have proven successful in communities throughout the state in rehabilitating offenders with drug and alcohol addictions.
